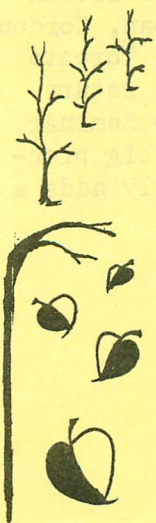

The ITV program revolves around the concept of Zen. Dr. David Young, Anthropology professor at U of A, served as chief commentator and advisor. Mrs. H. Umezawa demonstrated a chanoyu with guests, Professor Y. Miyakawa and Visiting Professor S. Arntzen. Mrs. J. Main, president of the Ikebana Club, brought two arrangements and explained the spirit and method of ikebana. Mrs. Michiko Young illustrated the sumi-e. Ted Hayakaze and friends demonstrated a kendo exercise. The foregoing cultural activities are deeply involved with zen. Although specifics are not yet available, this program is scheduled for January.

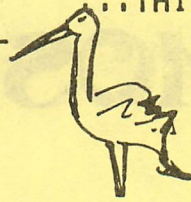

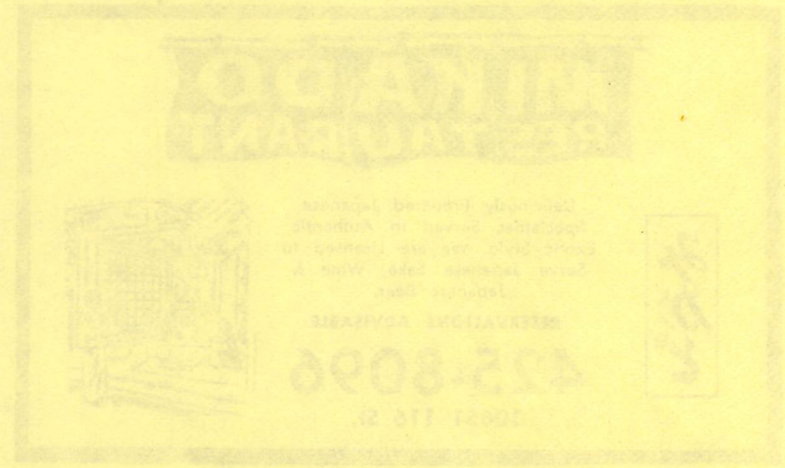
