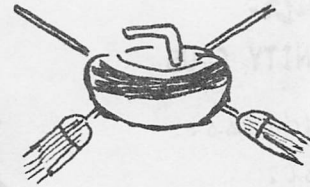
The activities of the club are meeting all the EJCCS objectives except that of fund raising. The funding guidelines used over the past year was to follow the precedence set by past boards. The club has been operating on the interest from its bank deposits, but due to inflation we are fast approaching the point when this will be inadequate. Our limited fund raising projects of Heritage Day, Bazaar, and Grey Cup Pool have ignored the fact the club needs annual operating revenue. We plan to double the number of Grey Cup Pool tickets to support the golf and curling activities and with a more aggressive approach to fund raising we should be able to satisfy our annual operating expenses.

The EJCCS some years ago did undertake a very successful fund raising Casino. David Tsujikawa has looked into the possibilities of another Casino or fund raising Bingo. He found that the application now require a more detailed description of the specific project and fund requirement. The generalized statement used in the last Casino application is no longer acceptable. We require a long term project plan before we can apply for a Casino or Bingo.

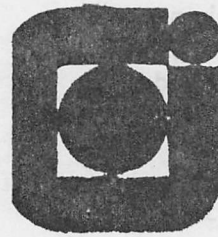
Miyako Okubo has submitted a request to Ottawa to have our club registered as a tax deductible organization. If approved, members and the business community may be more inclined to make a larger tax deductible donations to the club.

During June of 1982 Consul-General of Japan Tomihari and Mrs. Tomihari slipped quietly into Edmonton. The Consul-General assumed his duties immediately, but some of us had early opportunities to meet them when they attended the Fun Golf Tournament at Jasper, and later, at the events of Klondike Days.

The Consul-General came to Edmonton from his post as Master of Ceremonies of the Imperial Household. He was born in Tokyo on January 3, 1924. He graduated from Chuo University in economics in 1948.

A career diplomat he has been with the Foreign Ministry ever since graduation. His first foreign tour began with a stint at Cambodia, returning to Tokyo to serve in the United Nations Bureau (his 5 year service included three trips to the UN in New York City). His second foreign duty took him to Melbourne for 4½ years. This was followed by assignment to the Econ. Affairs section of Asian Affairs Bureau in Tokyo.

The Consul-General's first North American posting was to Seattle as Consul, 1971-73. From there he went to Madagascar as First Secretary of the Japanese Embassy, 1973-76.

Edmonton and all of Alberta extend a warm welcome to Consul-General Shinichiro Tomihari and Mrs. Tomihari, and wish them a very pleasant and productive stay.

GOING BACK.....

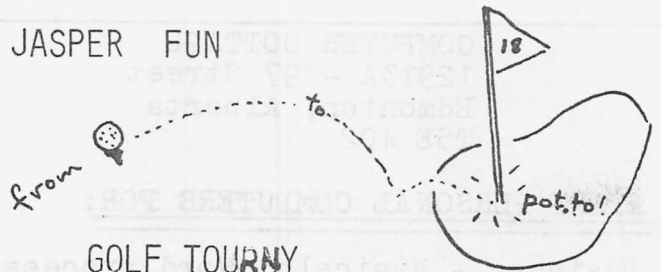

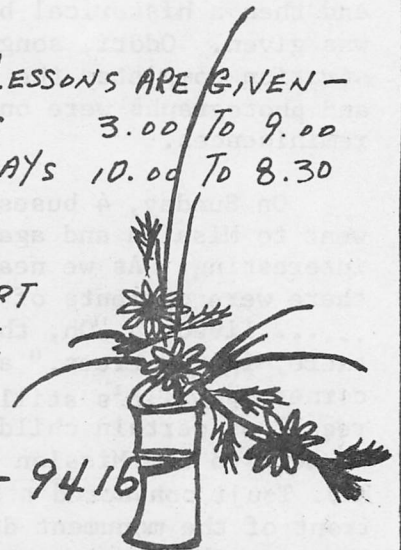
